Aim of Activity *

The Activity aims to increase the delivery and integration of holistic, trauma informed strategies that work to reduce the impact of social and emotional factors contributing to alcohol and/or other drug related harms among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

The Activity will work closely with mental health and chronic disease services to enable the early identification and culturally appropriate treatment for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people with physical and mental health challenges, who have co-occurring AOD related harms.

Description of Activity *

Healthy North Coast have directly commissioned the Aboriginal Controlled Health Organisations across the North Coast, to deliver specialist and localised drug and alcohol treatment services to Aboriginal and or Torres Strait Islander people across the region. Through the program, consumers can access drug and alcohol treatment services and care coordination to support engagement with supports that aid recovery and, if required, support to navigate health systems for ambulatory or relapse prevention treatment.

The drug and alcohol treatment service provision sits alongside the Aboriginal Social and Emotional Wellbeing program, ensuring culturally safe care, which considers needs across the domains of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health and wellbeing.

The Buttery will deliver the Drug and Alcohol Treatment Program through a 5-point stepped care approach

Entry points into the Drug and Alcohol Treatment Program will be via:

- Hub/spokes in both the Drug and Alcohol Treatment Program and Primary Mental Health Program
- Clinical Care Navigators, Peer Advocates and Community Connectors
- Medicare Mental Health Intake, Assessment and Referral Service for outbound referrals

Once entering the service, the provider will undertake a comprehensive assessment and develop a care plan and link the client with Drug and Alcohol Treatment Program Spoke Treatment Services funded by HNC.

AOD Counselling Program - Stepped care level 2,3 and 4

Description of service

Community-based service for people over the age of 18 years.

The program will offer individual counselling and case management support to people with AOD and mental health concerns along with support in a group setting.

The program will focus on withdrawal safety and engaging parent, supports and carers in the treatment, with the client's consent.

The aim of the Drug and Alcohol Treatment Program is to:

Description of Activity *

Alcohol and Other Drugs Relapse Prevention

- Supports people to re-engage with education, employment; housing services; and/or family/community. The service also supports GPs managing people with alcohol and other drug dependence who are at risk of relapse.

Modified Activity

The Drug and Alcohol Treatment program will align with the Primary Mental Health Programs Hub and Spoke model of care, offering a comprehensive whole of health approach to wellness where hub(s) locations have specialist, multidisciplinary integrated care teams and spokes to facilitate delivery of these services across isolated, regional, rural and/or remote geographical locations in the North Coast region.

The provider will deliver community-based, outpatient, withdrawal management support for individuals with low to moderate risk of complicated withdrawal symptoms and or mental health concerns.

The provider will support post-withdrawal management planning at commencement of engagement and through withdrawal episode.

The provider will work with the client to ensure care is managed in a community setting and escalate client to tertiary care if higher level supports are needed.

By working collaboratively with the Ministry of Health and Mid North Coast Local Health District, the Drug and Alcohol Treatment Program will include coordination and care in the primary care setting to support Opioid Treatment Prescribing Programs and opioid related treatment in the community.
