

New training opportunity: better recognise and respond to domestic violence

GP EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST NOW OPEN

Women experience domestic violence at the same rate that they experience asthma and diabetes. Each week, approximately five women who are experiencing violence perpetrated by an intimate partner present to their GP with a variety of issues and symptoms. Patients experiencing domestic and family violence first tell a doctor or a nurse about the abuse before other professionals. Many patients will not display any obvious physical indicators of the abuse but the harm can be severe and long lasting.

Training to recognise and respond to domestic violence can equip GPs to both initiate conversations about domestic violence, and to respond with competence and confidence to disclosures. Expressions of Interest are sought from GPs to participate in a six month pilot project. As part of the project GPs will:

- receive training in domestic violence routine screening and response
- be supported to undertake domestic violence screening of female patients over a six month period.

GPs who participate in the project will be fully supported with resources for patients, and information about referral pathways.
GPs will also have access to ongoing personal support to respond to questions or issues that arise as they build capacity to engage with this important work.

Four-hour training will be provided to GPs in June 2019, and the supported and monitored screening will take place between June and December 2019. If most or all GPs in a given practice agree to the project, training can be provided on site. If individual GPs participate from various practices, the training will be provided at a central location. There is no minimum or maximum number of GPs from a given practice required for the training and project to advance.
